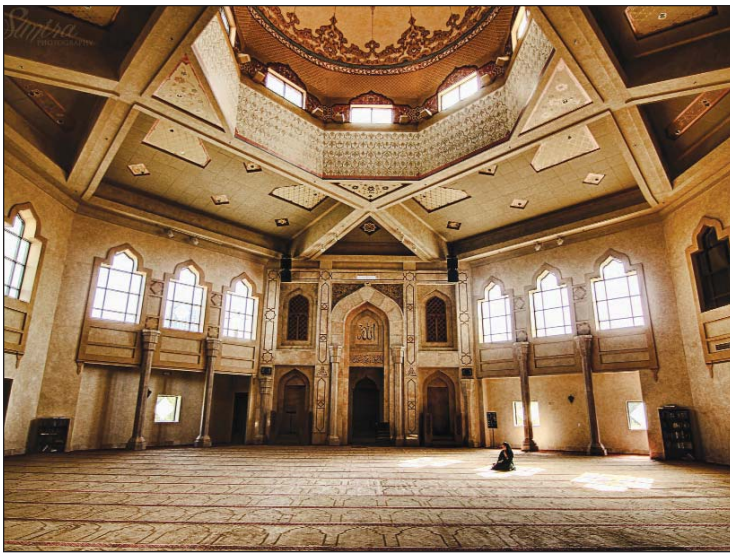

Gifted by Otherness

In many church communities, LGBT Christians are in the awkward position of trying to explain themselves to two mutually hostile audiences. On the one side, the LGBT community is often deeply suspicious of anyone connected

with Christianity. On the other side sits the church, which often wishes that gays and lesbians would go away, or at least disappear into the woodwork quietly. But the LGBT community has a unique vocation in today's church, one of challenging the church to be inclusive of all God's children – the central message of the Gospel. How can “LGBT otherness,” viewed as a gift, shed light on the “otherness” to which all Christians are called? What are the distinctions among tolerance, acceptance, affirmation, celebration? 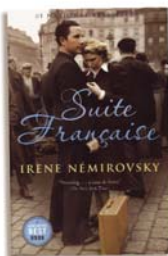
Men's Breakfast Eggnomics Series: Michael Chriszt, Assistant Vice President, Research Department, Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta

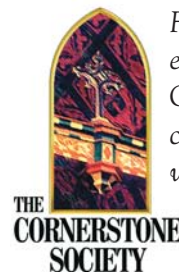

New Year's Resolutions

If you're like a lot of us, your diet figures prominently on your list of New Year's resolutions. Make it different this year – resolve to eat better by participating in All Saints' own Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) operated by Moore Farms & Friends. Science now shows that eating more vegetables and fruits are part of a well balanced approach to healthy weight maintenance.

Plus the benefits don't stop there:

- 🌱 Supporting our local economy: A recent UGA study found that if Georgia families spent \$10 a week on local food, it would generate almost 2 billion for our local economy.
- 🌱 Eating more fruits & vegetables—each farmer's pick box has several servings of fruits and vegetables. If you already have the food, it's much more likely to be eaten – and eating more plant based food lowers the fat and cholesterol in your diet.
- 🌱 Consuming fewer pesticides: much of the produce from the CSA is organic (it's specified each week). Pesticides are harmful to us all, but especially to children. The food choices we make impact all our health – now and in the future.
- 🌱 Saving energy: the average grocery store meal travels 1,500 miles from the farm to your table. By eating local produce, you lower the amount of gas used and emissions that go into our air.
- 🌱 Save local farms: local families rely on farming for their livelihood. Over the past decade, it's estimated that 650,000 US farms have ceased operation. By buying from local farmers, you ensure we'll have a stable supply of local, healthy food for the future.



Go to www.moorefarmsandfriends.com to see how easy it is. If you're a first time user, you'll have to join. The \$25 membership fee is good for an entire year and it allows you the ability to order food only when you need it.

Once you've joined, you can choose your order. There are two options for the basic order: Custom orders or *Farmer's Pick*. The *Farmer's Pick* is usually the best deal with boxes to fit your family size, at \$20 or \$30 each. You can also add any items you'd like from the extensive online market. A custom order is \$5 plus whatever you'd like from the online market listing of dairy & eggs, fresh flowers, fruit, certified organic from farther afield, garlic/spices/herbs, gift items, grains/nuts/coffee, granola, honey/jams/jellies, meats, vegetables, soaps/lotions or pet products. Either way, decide what you're likely to use and order the items you'll need.

All Saints' is the pick-up location most of us use as it's convenient for Wednesday night church activities and those who work in midtown. Pick up is anytime between 11:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. on Wednesdays. If that doesn't work for you, there are lots of other pick up times and locations to choose from.

A report on the 105th Annual Council of the Diocese of Atlanta including a report on the Church of the Common Ground was made. An endowment request to support the Church of the Common Ground in the amount of \$10,000 was adopted.

An update on the Bishop selection process was discussed and Geoffrey pointed out that the Diocesan Council was technically adjourned until June for the election of the new Bishop.

Ballots must be returned to the church office either by U.S. Mail, postmarked no later than Monday, April 9, or by hand delivery no later than 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, April 11.

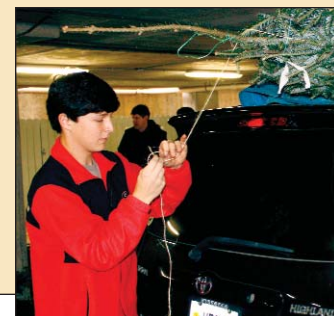

Anatomy of Suicide: The Church's Response*January 11–February 15; 7:00 p.m. in P305*

Explore the causes of suicide, its prevention, and how we as the body of Christ might respond to individuals who are prone to commit suicide and to families who have lost a loved one through suicide. An estimated 90% of people who take their lives had suffered from an underlying mental health condition and/or a substance abuse problem at the time of death. With education, awareness, and treatment people can be helped, so that suicide does not become an option for people living with seemingly intractable pain.

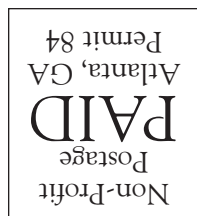
Young Adult Lenten Study*February 29–March 28; 6:30 p.m. in P305*
