God is here and He is in the ATTIC!



February 21 marks the date of the premier event in The Attic – *The 6th Grade Attic Invasion*. The youth space on the 3rd floor of the Pritchett Center is almost ready for action. And

there will be action: open space for large group activities, games and performances. Plus small group discussion and activity spaces – cushy sofas and bean bag chairs, a kitchen for baking cookies and making meals together, and meeting space and classrooms for youth formation and small groups.

What you notice first about the space is that it is wired for everything: a large screen is stationed by the entrance listing upcoming activities, another screen sits opposite for movies and presentations. Cool tubular lighting hangs down like something out of the future. Dimmers, speakers, retractable ceiling screens and even the basketball hoop that folds down are controlled by remotes and apps. The classrooms feature technology and closed-circuit cameras have been installed to add security.

During their “off-hours” high school and middle school parishioners will now be offered time to play foosball, basketball, *Nine Square in the Air*, “Kind” Dodge Ball (the balls are made of foam) Ping Pong, board games and more. There will be more service opportunities and retreats. And while Xbox and Wii will figure into the mix, the youth space serves another purpose, too: a place to just come and “BE”. Tim Black, priest in charge of Youth Formation asks, “How can we best serve the young people of this church? That doesn’t necessarily mean more programming. This space allows us to find the balance between having space to do more but also offer “down time” where the youth can relax and study and socialize at times where they could not in the past. How about a yoga class and tutoring and a place to hang out during exams? We don’t want to be another thing piled up on their schedules. We are not school! We want to be like Martin Luther King’s “beloved community”; where young people are nurtured and God’s transforming grace is at work in their lives.

Lots of care has been given to details... bathrooms are ADA approved and floors not “slick”, cubbies offer space for bookbags and a place to charge phones and laptops via plugs and USB ports. Soft flooring is in the rec area. Windows are “Low E” and have impact-resistant glass. Some walls are made of recycled gym flooring and some tables are recycled skateboards! The lighting is “T-5, Energy saving.” The architects have made great environmental choices that most of us haven’t seen anywhere else.



Tim adds, “We want to make church a priority for our youth. I can’t wait to show the space to the whole parish. I really can’t wait to see what God will do with The Attic. Stay tuned for dates for your tour!” ✝

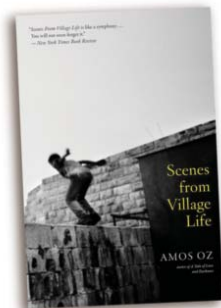

Be a Volunteer with Refugee Ministries in 2014



All Saints' Refugee Ministries is rooted in the transforming relationships that develop between parishioners and newly-arrived refugees in the Atlanta area. Parishioners can help families in many differ-

ent ways, including English and GED tutoring, arranging and driving to medical and other appointments, helping refugees pay bills, and offering advice on life in the U.S. Here are a few ways you can begin to become involved in 2014:

English tutoring in Clarkston:

Bimonthly and monthly commitments welcome!

- Help teach an adult ESL class for absolute beginners. *Wednesdays, 2:30–3:30 p.m. (4 volunteers needed)*
