The final concert of the All Saints' Concert Series for the anniversary year is also the first concert of the Atlanta Summer Organ Festival.

This festival showcases notable organs in the city of Atlanta and world renowned organists. All Saints' is honored to have been chosen once again to participate in this

four-concert series. Matthew Owens is the current Organist & Master of the Choristers of Wells Cathedral. He is well regarded as a distinguished organist, and prize-winning conductor, as well as



a lauded composer. He was previously Organ Scholar at The Queen's College, Oxford, from where he graduated in music. As an organist, Matthew has given recitals in Australia, France, the Republic of Ireland, Switzerland and throughout the UK, including many festival appearances, and at venues such as St Paul's Cathedral, Westminster Cathedral, and St John's Smith Square. He has championed new music, particularly of British composers, premiering many new works by leading composers including Jools Holland, James MacMillan, John Rutter, and Sir Peter Maxwell Davies.

Vestry Notes

From the meeting on April 14, 2014

The April vestry meeting opened with a wonderful meditation by Alvin Moore beginning with his Baptist roots and ending with his connections to All Saints' through music and Barbara Brown Taylor. Mose Bond announced the slate of the new vestry class that will be presented at the April 27 Parish Meeting. The slate includes: Elizabeth Klump, Erin Miller, Katrina Newton, Charlie Ogburn, Ken Stewart and Robert Waddell.

The Treasurer's report given by Lee Robinson in Michael Gragnani's absence noted that while pledge payments are down, it is hoped that with Easter being in April, some of this gap will close. Expenses were also below budget due to timing differences. The Report was unanimously approved. Lee also reported that the Finance Committee has been evaluating the credit card policy for All Saints' due to the annual cost of merchant fees being incurred to process pledge payments.

The Senior Warden, Greg Giornelli, reported on problems with the five year old roof on the parish house. It is under warranty, and the problems will be addressed before work begins in the parish house. John Mears showed architectural plans for the third floor of the parish house and for Ellis Hall. The motion to approve the schematics for the parish house was approved unanimously. A motion was also made and passed to rename the courtyard following renovation to "The Kennedy Courtyard" instead of "The Kennedy Garden".

The motions to adopt the minutes from the March 17 vestry meeting and to adopt The Parochial Report were both passed unanimously. After a time of prayer, the meeting was adjourned.

From the meeting on May 5, 2014

The May meeting marked the vestry's "transition meeting", and thanks were given to the third year class of Greg Giornelli, Mose Bond, Elizabeth Hale, Kathy Roberts, Jere Wells, and Comer Yates. Greg concluded his year as Senior Warden with a wonderful meditation of his three years serving on vestry. New vestry officers were elected. Bob Miller will serve as Senior Warden, Elizabeth Nadal as Junior Warden, Michael Gragnani as Treasurer, and Elizabeth Barton will serve as Clerk. Five people were elected as delegates to the Annual Council of the Diocese: Bruce Garner, Alvin Moore, Kathy Roberts, Janet Todd, and Robert Waddell. Five others were elected as alternate delegates: Jamie Clements, Richard Hall, Wright Marshall, Mary Margaret Oliver, and Kara Wilkes.

Geoffrey Hoare presented his written report highlighting his comments at the Annual Parish meeting. The Parish will celebrate Chuck Girardeau's service at a reception on May 18. Ellen Hayes gave the final stewardship report for the 2014 campaign. To date we have received 809 pledges for a total of \$2,670,800 pledged. This is a little over the budgeted pledge number. Jenny and Kevin Lyman will chair the campaign for 2014/2015.

The minutes of the April meeting were also approved. Following a time of prayer, the meeting was adjourned.
