





Vestry Notes

From the meeting on June 16, 2014

The vestry meeting opened with an update from John Mears on various capital projects. Contractors were set to begin work on the Parish House roof. Tate Hall will be getting a facelift and will serve as our go to space this Fall for Sunday gatherings and Wednesday Night Suppers during the construction in Ellis Hall. The Parish House construction is scheduled to begin at the end of August and to be completed in December. Revised plans for the Kennedy Courtyard are being worked on. The stained glass windows are back and will be installed by the first of August. The frame for the Egleston-Hale Window is not complete, so there will be a delay in its reinstallation. We will be worshipping in folding chairs while the pews are being stained, and Sunday, August 10 will find us in Ellis Hall while the floors of the church are stained. Bob Miller, Senior Warden, gave a wonderful meditation with a first-hand account of desegregation at UGA in January 1961. Michael Gragnani gave the treasurer's report noting that pledge payments came in over budget for May, non-pledge contributions were down, and we received a one time gift of \$5,000. Overall, we are ahead of what we anticipated and are on a good track. The report was unanimously approved. The motion to place an additional gift of \$59,746 from the estate of Laurie Taylor into the Laurie Taylor Fund within the Centennial Endowment as recommended by the Executive Committee was approved unanimously by the vestry.

To ensure that All Saints' remains a drop off point for Moore Farms CSA the number of orders needs to increase.

Our ASAP Interns joined us for a portion of the meeting, allowing us the opportunity to hear about their year and say goodbye as they move on.

Geoffrey Hoare presented his report, referencing an article about Ressourcement and the need to figure out how growth in the church is measured and what growth means. The Stewardship campaign is kicking into high gear, with 20-25 stewards who will be participating in small group dinners as they prepare for their canvass work this fall. Robert Waddell, just back from the 10th grade pilgrimage, reported that the trip to Ireland was a meaningful and spiritual experience. The minutes of the May 2014 vestry meeting were also unanimously approved by the vestry. The meeting was then adjourned following a time of prayer.

All vestry meetings are open and meet at 4:30 p.m. on the 3rd floor of the Parish House with dates announced in The All Saints' Monthly.
