11th Annual Woodall Lecture Connects Music and the Church

Dr. Dwight D. Andrews, minister, musician, and educator, will bring his personal spiritual and musical experience to All Saints' for the 11th Annual Woodall Lecture. Joined by several musical colleagues, Dr. Andrews will entertain us with jazz, as he connects music and the church for a very different Woodall Lecture. His background in both is more than impressive. Dr. Andrews is an Associate Professor of Music Theory and African American Music at Emory University and Senior Minister of First Congregational United Church of Christ in Atlanta. He received his Bachelor's and Master's degrees in music from the University of Michigan and a Master's of Divinity and PhD. in Music Theory from Yale. At Yale, he was on the faculty of the Music Department and African American Studies Program for more than ten years and was Resident Music Director of the Yale Repertory Theater.

While at Yale, he began to work with playwright August Wilson, serving as music director for Wilson's Broadway hits *Ma Rainey's Black Bottom*, *Joe Turner's Come and Gone*, *Fences*, *The Piano Lesson*, and *Seven Guitars*. Andrews'

musical credentials include PBS and HBO films, and he has been a multi-instrumentalist sideman on over twenty-five jazz and "new music" albums. He has received a number of awards, including Lexus Leader of the Arts, Emory University's Distinguished Teacher Award and the Yale Tercentenary Medal from the Yale Club of Georgia.

All of these achievements are neatly summed up on his biography on the First Church website: "Dr. Andrews views his preaching, teaching, community work and music as discrete parts of a single public ministry. In each of these capacities he thinks of himself, first and foremost, as a minister. This perspective informs the way he performs his duties in the pulpit, the classroom and on the concert stage. Andrews carries his ministry wherever he goes and is grateful that God continues to provide him with wonderful opportunities for ministry – within the walls of the church and without." What could be more perfect for an evening at All Saints'?

The Woodall Lecture Series was established in gratitude to Ann Woodall for her extraordinary service to All Saints' and for her loving and gracious leadership of the 2001–2003 All Saints' Church Centennial. Each autumn, All Saints' hosts an innovative and influential theologian who offers, in Ann's words, "a banquet for our souls". ✚

Volunteer with Refugee Ministries

Help Welcome a New Refugee Family!

Every October All Saints' welcomes a new refugee family to the United States. We are looking for volunteers to help prepare for move-in day by organizing and inventorying our storage closet that holds all the furniture and other items All Saints' parishioners have donated over the last year for our family.

Move-In Day is a really fun annual event and a great way to become introduced to Refugee Ministries. We'll meet at All Saints' to load-up furniture and then transport it to an apartment in Clarkston (location TBA). If you or anyone you know is able to do heavy lifting, we would love to have your help! If you are not able to lift, help will also be needed unpacking the kitchen, making beds, and decorating. We are also looking for a volunteer or group to bring lunch to the volunteers that day. It's always a special experience to fill a home with love for a family that has been through so much.

Ongoing help for our new family. We won't know anything about our new family or about their arrival time until about a week before they arrive, due to Refugee Agency complications in processing and flight schedules. But once they arrive (shortly after October 18) the flurry of activity to help them transition to life in the United States will begin, especially during their first three

months here. Lots of volunteers are needed for this resettlement; even a one-time volunteer is greatly appreciated. Volunteer activities include: shopping for a week's worth of groceries prior to the family's arrival, the airport greeting, cooking a hot meal for their first night here, taking the family to Threads and the Farmer's Market or Thriftdown, helping to plan a welcome party, MARTA orientation, and helping the family learn English.

Families with children third grade and up are welcome to volunteer for any of the preparation or post arrival activities. We love family volunteers and are happy to give needed service hours to children and adolescents. The help we give our new family now will matter for the rest of their lives. ✝

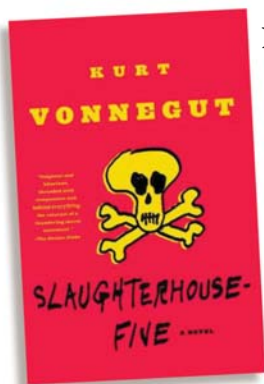
**Something To Talk About:

Vestry Notes

From the meeting on September 15, 2014

The September vestry meeting began with a meditation from Janet Todd. We had several guests at this meeting, including The Rev'd Stefanie Taylor, who has joined the clergy as a Sunday Associate Priest, with Sunday Children's Church her main duty, this year's ASAP interns, Demarius, James, Josey and Shereetha, and Mary Beth Toole, the interim Director of Children's Ministries.

John Mears gave us an update on the various construction projects. The Ellis Hall project should begin in the next few weeks and is slated to last 4.5 months, with an estimated completion date of early/mid March. Once that work is complete, we will go into reworking the courtyard and vestibule. This project will begin early spring and run through the summer. Trimming out the windows is all that is left to be done on the Pritchett Center. This should take less than 2 weeks. Most of the work on the stained glass is complete. They are still working on the frame production for the Egleston Hale Window.

Michael Gagnani presented the Treasurer's report, noting that we are well funded. He noted that August was under budget in pledge payments, but we are over budget for the year.

Lauri Begley reported that a great attendance is expected for Egg-Onomics tomorrow. On October 25 there will be two Youth Choir concerts with a barbecue dinner between. This takes the place of the Fall Festival. Ellen Hayes reported on the stewardship campaign. 103 pledges came in during early pledging, including 100% of the vestry and the Stewards. Sunday's video screening was well received. Dr. Rodger Nishioka, of Columbia Theological Seminary, led a lively talk in Ellis Hall with about 150 in attendance.

The meeting was then adjourned following a time of prayer.
