The Rev'd Dr. H. King Oehmig

The Rev'd Dr. H. King Oehmig, an Episcopal priest from Chattanooga, is the author/publisher of a three-volume lay commentary *Understanding the Sunday Scriptures: A Companion to the Revised Common Lectionary*. Oehmig is also author of *Between the Lines: Reflections on the Gospels Through the Church Year* and *Beyond the Words: Insights on the Gospels Through the Church Year*.

He is a graduate of the University of Virginia and the School of Theology at the University of the South. Dr. Oehmig has also served parishes in Tennessee, Mississippi, and Georgia over the last 30 years in addition to his writing life. Upon retiring from coaching high school golf at Baylor School in Chattanooga, where he garnered 21 TSSAA titles over 12 years and was named USA Coach of the Year in Girls' Golf in 2007, Oehmig was recently appointed to the faculty of the University of the South, Sewanee, Tennessee, as Interim Men's Golf Coach. ✚

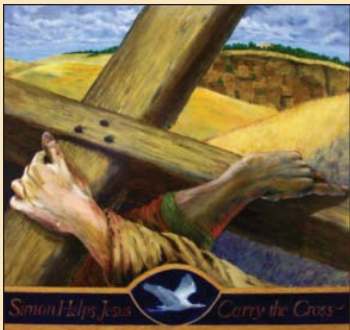

With William A. Sessions, American author, biographer and professor emeritus of English at Georgia State University.

Join us as we welcome W. A. (Bill) Sessions, Regents' Professor of English Emeritus at

Georgia State University and author of the authorized biography of Flannery O'Connor. His articles on Flannery O'Connor have appeared in *Shenandoah: The Washington and Lee University Review*, the *National Catholic Reporter* and *Studies in Short Fiction*. He has presented papers on Flannery O'Connor at the International Flannery O'Connor Conference at Brigham Young University in 1995, at the American Literature national convention, at the South Central Modern Language Association Conference, and at other conferences and universities. Sessions also has authored several books on famous writers, including Henry Howard, the Poet Earl of Surrey, and Sir Francis Bacon and myriad articles on famous writers and their works. The Founding Editor of *The Carolina Quarterly* (University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill) and *Studies in the Literary Imagination* (Georgia State University), he has won numerous awards, including the Nikos Kazantzakis Medal from Greece, the Outstanding Teacher Award for the South Atlantic Association of Departments of English and an honorary degree from Coastal Carolina University. Sessions' poetry has been published in *The Southern Review*, *The Georgia Review*, and *The Chattahoochee Review*, among others. He has written several plays, including *A Shattering of Glass*, a winner in the Southern Theatre Playwrights Competition and produced at the University of Mississippi for the Festival of Southern Theatre.



How William Blake Can Help Us Read The Bible

With Professor Christopher C. Rowland, The Dean Ireland's Professor for the Exegesis of Holy Scripture, Queen's College, Oxford University

Join us in welcoming Professor Christopher

C. Rowland, this year's Emory Oxford College Pierce Visiting Scholar. Rowland was appointed as The Dean Ireland's Professor for the Exegesis of Holy Scripture in 1991, the most prestigious chair in New Testament Studies in Great Britain. He is the author of numerous books that have impacted biblical studies in significant ways, beginning with his groundbreaking study of the book of Revelation, *The Open Heaven* (1982). His contributions include major works dedicated to liberation theology, the apocalyptic tradition in ancient Judaism and Christianity, Christian origins, the reception history of the Bible, methods in grassroots readings of the Bible, radical Christianity, and numerous other fields. His most recent book, *Blake and the Bible*, is a brilliant study of Blake's poetic genius and his unique contributions to the interpretation of the Bible in text and image. Rowland's scholarship is as impressive for its breadth as for its depth, and it is also distinctive because of his concern for liberation, justice, and equality that stems from an ethical response to and critique of biblical texts. His distinguished career has included many accolades, distinguished lectureships, and other honors. His status as an internationally recognized scholar also has been celebrated in a Festschrift (a volume of scholarly essays presented as a tribute to a renowned scholar): *Radical Christian Voices and Practice*.

Capital Projects Update: Where are we now?



The protective covering process for the stained glass windows on the sides of the church is nearing completion. The new covering is transparent and will permit the brilliance of the windows to be visible from the outside.

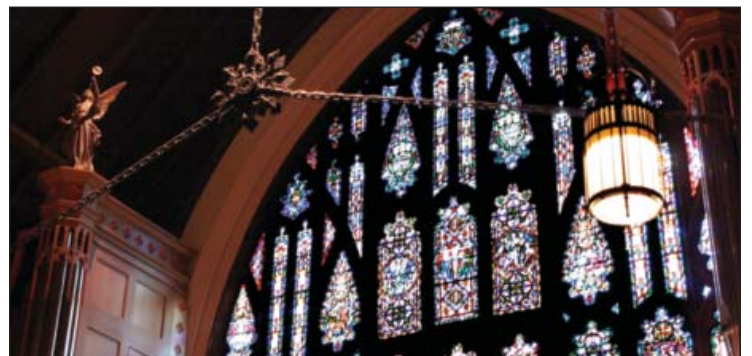
Planning and restoration work continues on the Egleston-Hale window. Some repairs to the masonry substrate are necessary to provide proper anchoring

material for the new frame. There are also several different types of electrical wires running along the sill area that will be maintained and organized.

In February, Chuck Konas, the windows consultant and structural engineer went to the restoration studio to review the work in progress on the Egleston-Hale window (pictured right). The interior steel of the new frame will be clad in wood.

The frame contractor laid out a full size drawing of the frame on the floor of his shop using full size templates taken from the actual windows. The project is scheduled for completion in the summer and its reinstallation will mark the completion of all Capital Campaign projects for the church itself. ✝
