Our annual Celebration of Ministries Sunday marks the official start of the program year. This is the perfect opportunity to experience the joy and celebration of our many and varied

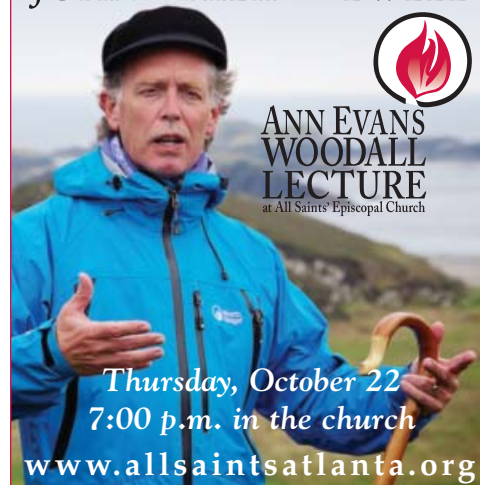

*From the meeting on May 18, 2014*

The vestry received a report on the status of several projects on campus. The courtyard work will begin soon and is expected to take approximately three months to complete. Scaffolding will be erected this summer for the installation of the Egelston-Hale window.

The Pritchett Center restoration has been completed and came in under budget. The financial report was positive, operating

expenses are down and the endowment is strong. Tim Black provided an introduction of the first Youth Leadership Council (YLC) and encouraged all youth who are interested to apply. The minutes of the May meeting were approved and the meeting was adjourned after a time of prayer and a hymn.
