Hasse *Requiem* on All Saints' Sunday

On All Saints' Sunday the All Saints' choir, directed by Choirmaster Raymond Chenault, will sing the beautiful and rarely performed *Requiem in E-flat* by Johann Adolf Hasse, a contemporary of J. S. Bach and Mozart. Written for SATB choir and six soloists and orchestra (two flutes, two oboes, two horns, strings and organ continuo), this requiem is divided into 20 movements, many of which are quite short. Four of these will be sung as part of a 10 minute prelude. If you like Mozart's *Requiem*, you will enjoy

Hasse's *Requiem* as it sounds much like the music of Mozart, who likely heard the work at the young age of 8. Undoubtedly, Hasse's music and style influenced Mozart. This music will be extremely moving as we remember all who have gone before us this All Saints' Day. ✚

Vestry Notes

From the meeting on September 21, 2015

The meeting opened with Charlie Ogburn's meditation. The minutes of the August 17, 2015 meeting were adopted unanimously. Charlie provided the Treasurer's report stating that the financial condition of church is sound. He added that the 2016 Budget subcommittee has started to meet to plan for next year's budget. Scott Hayes joined the vestry to discuss a new telephone system. The current phone system is old and does not work well. Scott and Nancy reviewed various proposals for new systems and found that Milner Technologies offered the best proposal for the needs of the church. The vestry approved the motion to enter into a five-year lease with Milner with a \$1.00 buyout provision.

Robert Waddell provided a summary of the canvass, reporting that around 100 people attended the official kick off for the canvass, a presentation delivered by Bishop Doyle on September 17. To date, we have received 238 pledges.

The rector reported that a purchase offer for Carlson property has been drafted and the purchase and sale agreement should be signed soon. Finance Committee continues to explore different options for financing. Geoffrey discussed the communion service now offered during Wednesday Night Supper. The service takes about 5 minutes and appears to be well received.

The Sunday, September 6, service went well. Kathy reiterated her need for volunteers in Children's Formation.

Noelle reported that the adult formation racism discussions went well. Feedback on breaking groups out by age has been positive. The ASAP house blessing was canceled due to a third round of bed bug infestation.

The meeting adjourned following prayer.
