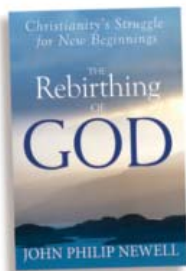

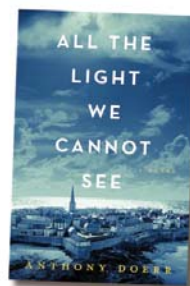

Vestry Notes

From the meeting on August 17, 2015

The vestry opened the meeting following Holy Eucharist in the Chapel.

Noelle welcomed the fourth class of the ASAP interns. They introduced themselves and provided their volunteer assignments. Sloan Smith and Mose Bond joined the vestry to discuss the stewardship campaign and its dedication to our core spiritual practices of “pray, serve, give.” Ellen and Sloan discussed our ambitious goal to make a connection with all parishioners by hand delivering the 1200 pledge cards. Geoffrey added that giving is fundamental to our ministry and who we are as a community. We want to invite others to commit to the practice of generosity and the freedom it provides.

The Senior Warden reported on the status of negotiations with Bright Horizons. The lease has been signed for three years starting September 1, 2015. Charlie Ogburn reported

that the financial condition of the parish is good. We are ahead of budget year to date. The Finance Committee has begun planning for the 2016 budget by appointing a subcommittee. The Treasurer’s report was unanimously adopted.

Geoffrey drew the vestry’s attention to the new adult formation series, including the Preacher-Teacher series. Tim discussed the pilgrimage in his report and the new format for youth formation. Noelle commented that she, Tim and Kathy met for formation planning to keep it consistent and cross-generational.

The meeting was then adjourned following a time of prayer.

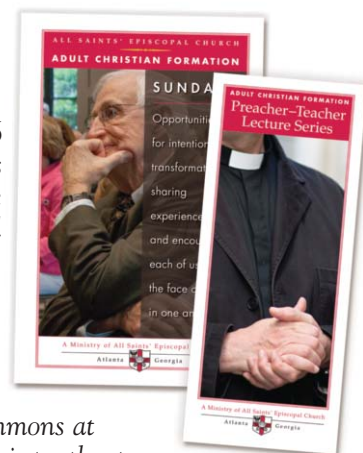
Preacher-Teacher Series:
