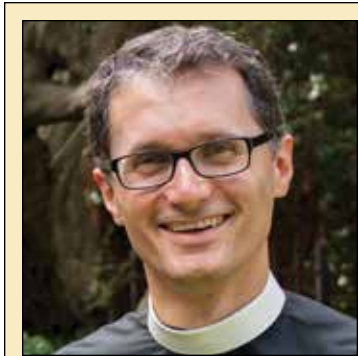

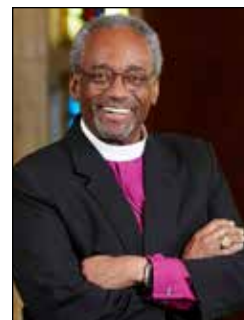

faculty of the College of Wooster (Ohio) and is also the Assistant Organist at Christ Church Grosse Pointe, in Michigan.

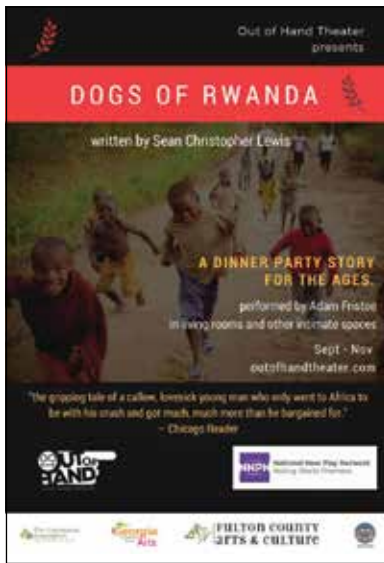

## Dogs of Rwanda Coming to All Saints'!

Arts Theology and Out of Hand Theater proudly bring an emotional new play, *Dogs of Rwanda*, to All Saints'. This is the story of David, who at 16 years old, finds himself in Uganda as a church missionary. As they watch bodies float down the river, they meet a boy named God's Blessing, who leads them into the woods. On the 20th anniversary of the genocide he witnessed firsthand a book David wrote regarding his experiences that spring arrives with a note from the Rwandan boy he once tried to save. "You didn't tell them everything," it says.



the action-filled chronicle are riveting – an enormous challenge in a solo show. Past and present weave together in this account of an episode so harrowing that David will never recover from it, no matter how many books he writes and how earnestly he wants to honor God's Blessing as the hero of his youth. *Dogs of Rwanda* offers no easy moral lessons, only psychological traumas and philosophical meditations on the evil in the world. It is, the play shows us, hard to find forgiveness. It is, it shows us, worse

to be left unjudged than judged."

The play will be presented in the intimate setting of the Egleston Library and is sure to be a memorable experience.
