Fall Festival & Artists Market



On the first Sunday each November, we join Christians around the globe in honoring the traditional Feast of All Saints, a celebration set aside for giving thanks for all the faithful saints in our lives – the sung and the unsung; those gone before us and those among us still. As a community named for all the saints, our observance of this feast is particularly robust and includes our weekend-long annual Fall Festival, a chance for saints young and old to celebrate the gifts of God in arts, crafts, music, food, beverage, and live entertainment.

The festival kicks off Friday evening, November 2nd with a cocktail reception with live music, an appetizer buffet, and early access to shopping the Artists Market. This year we welcome back former Associate Rector and esteemed writer, preacher, and teacher The Rev. Barbara Brown Taylor, who will be selling and signing copies of her new children's book, *Home by Another Way*. The Artists Market includes



over 30 artisans from the parish and wider community, many new to our market, who offer pottery, paintings, photography, weaving, knitting, jewelry, gourmet foods, and a variety of other fine arts and crafts.

The festival continues Saturday with activities for all ages in the courtyard and playground,

including a performance by our children's choir, carnival games, the Youth Ministry Christmas tree sale, and a barbecue lunch. The Artists Market will remain open throughout the day, with proceeds benefiting our summer Youth Confirmation Pilgrimage.

The weekend culminates on Sunday with additional

market hours and festival worship at the 9:00 and 11:15 a.m. services, when we will be joined by the Atlanta Symphony Brass Quintet and timpanist Lisa Morris. Music for brass and organ will precede each of those liturgies, and festive arrangements of the hymns for brass and organ will highlight the significance of that day and enhance the congregational hymns and service music.

Marian Consort

The All Saints' Concert Series kicks off its 2018–2019 series this month with the internationally renowned Marian Consort. This group has eight recordings to its credit, all of which have garnered wonderful reviews. They will perform a capella works from the Tudor period and pair them with twentieth and twenty-first century compositions from British composers. This concert will be their only performance in the Southeast, and it is not to be missed. The season will continue with the annual Coro Vocati Advent/Christmas concert on December 16. This program has been a sell-out for the past two years, so get your tickets early for this delightful Sunday afternoon concert. Following this, in January, the internationally-known and Atlanta-based Vega String Quartet will bring beautiful chamber music to our midtown venue. In February, the organ and percussion duo, Organized Rhythm, will perform. The organist, Clive Driskill-Smith, was featured several years ago on our

series, and he now teams up with percussionist Joseph Gramley for an exciting program.



Greer Lyle, All Saints' soprano, and St. Louis opera debut artist, will present a vocal recital in March. Vestry Notes

From the meeting on August 20, 2018

Simon opened the meeting with a prayer. Jenna Barone offered a meditation on how the Holy Spirit is at work in our lives. The minutes of the June vestry meeting and August 7 special meeting were approved. Charlie Ogburn offered the Treasurer's report. Our financial condition remains better than budget for the year to date. The vestry approved receipt of the Henson Family bequest and distribution of the first three tranches of that bequest. The vestry approved a plan for use of funds from the capital campaign that were designated to young adults' ministries, which will include, among other things, a new Associate

Rector for Young Adults and Innovation, and a Director of Digital Communications. The vestry approved the Strategic Plan for the next three program years. A motion that had passed earlier by email on All Saints' role in voter education and registration efforts was read into the minutes. Simon facilitated a discussion among the vestry and members of the parish in attendance on parish political engagement and voter registration efforts. The meeting was adjourned.

Clark Lemon, David Pacini, and Randall Bailey all deeply knowledgeable and engaging teachers, to campus this fall. Grace is the gift of God, but we can also bestow grace on others and they on us. Or we can choose not to give or accept the grace St. Paul talks about in Corinthians. American writers reveal the presence of grace—it's almost an obsession with many of them. They most clearly do it in the short story in which there's a brief story, characters in conflict, and a thought-provoking end. We will study the stories of Eudora Welty, well-known novelist and short story writer from Jackson, Mississippi. Stories will be available before class, and I hope—not require—that you read them ahead so you can discuss, give opinions, and ask questions. Maybe we'll discover just what grace is.
