Vestry Notes

From the meeting on October 15, 2018

Simon opened the meeting with a prayer. Nixon Lowe offered a meditation on how she was first introduced to All Saints' and how it has been a source of strength to her through life's challenges. The vestry approved the creation of the Planned Giving Committee, Worship Committee, and Block Planning Steering Committee. Staff members reported on progress on action items for the first quarter of the Strategic Plan. Charlie Ogburn and Nancy Dodson reported that our financial condition remains better than budget for the year to date, and the loan to acquire the remainder of the block has been fully repaid. Simon reported on his attendance at the Compass Rose Society meeting in London, and that the searches for Music

Director and Director of Digital Communications will soon come to a conclusion. In the Senior Warden's report, John Frazer reflected on the success of the Faith to Table dinners and the parish retreat at Kanuga. According to Lauri Begley, 358 people attended Kanuga. Tim Black discussed new prayers in our liturgy. Kim Jackson reported on All Saints' welcoming of two new refugee families. Ellen Hayes gave a progress report on the annual canvass. The vestry, clergy, and staff shared in an Order for Evening. The meeting was adjourned.

Scholar in Residence, Dr. Randall Bailey: The Hebrew Bible in Advent



During Advent we often focus our attention on the Gospel narratives surrounding the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. Instead, this course gives us an opportunity to more closely examine the Old Testament/Hebrew Bible, and to discover how those texts can help us grow closer to God during the season of Advent.

Dr. Bailey has lectured and preached at universities and churches on 5 continents. He is the author of one book and numerous articles on the Hebrew Bible and editor/coeditor of five books on racial/ethnic biblical interpretations. He concentrates on the relationship of Ancient Africa and the Hebrew Bible and specializes in ideological criticism, especially as regards the points

of intersection of race/ethnicity, gender, class, sex, sexual orientation and power in the biblical text. He is a community activist who often argues against oppressive theological positions and oppressive biblical texts regarding social matters.

Dr. Bailey is married to Ms. D. Jean Lewis Bailey, a retired librarian with the DeKalb County Board of Education, and they have two adult children, Omari and Imani.
