new Director of Music. It is with a grateful heart that I have accepted this call. 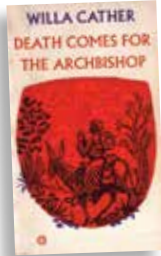

Vestry Notes

From the meeting on November 28, 2018

Simon opened the meeting with a prayer. David Aldridge, Chair of the Finance Committee, joined us for discussions regarding next year's budget. The vestry passed a motion to form a task force to study potential sources of additional income to be derived from use of our facilities. Dot Miller offered a meditation on what she has gained from pilgrimages she has taken with All Saints'. Zack Nyein provided update on the progress of the Communications Task Force and the Children and Youth Ministries Task Force. Nancy Dodson and Johnathan Stanford provided an update on the IT Task Force. Charlie Ogburn and Nancy Dodson reported that All Saints' remains in sound financial condition. Simon reported that the steering committee to study future use and development of the block has been formed.

A decision will be reached soon on hires for the new Music Director and then the Associate Rector for Young Adults and Innovation. Simon mentioned that the Head Verger position will no longer be a staff position, and he and the vestry expressed thanks for Bruce Garner's 20 years of service as Head Verger. John Frazer, Simon, and the vestry expressed thanks to Lauri Begley for her service as Director of Parish Life. Ellen Hayes gave a progress report on the annual canvass. Simon offered grace. The meeting was adjourned.
