
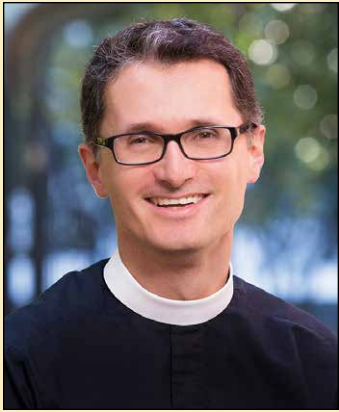

This is My Body

Dear Saints,

As we dwell in the mystery of Jesus' victory over sin and death during The Great 50 Days of Easter, I invite you to consider joining in an intentional season of honoring, exercising, and celebrating the body – your body – as an act of faith and devotion.

Jesus' own body is central to our tradition, and as the stories and symbols of Eastertide move us towards the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, materiality and physicality take on deepened significance. Vestry Notes

From the meeting on March 18, 2019

Mary Wyche Lesesne offered a mediation on “What church is for me,” describing her experiences at All Saints’ and the church she has found “out in the world.” Charlie Ogburn reported that the parish continues to be in sound financial condition. Holder Construction has leased two bays in our property along North Avenue. That income will largely replace lease income that we will lose when the Goodfellas lease ends. A motion passed approving a resolution designating the surplus from 2018 to a to-be established Property, Transition and Contingency Fund. The Future of Our Block has been meeting each month and is looking at gaps in services offered by other in-town service organizations, and what the plans and needs of major institutions in the area are. The Parish Life Task Force continues its work seeing where we are with parish life programs and how we can set up the new director to succeed. The IT, Communications, and Children and Youth Formation Ministries Task Forces also are continuing their work. Simon would like to involve members of the parish in exploring

ways to reach out to other faith communities, particularly the Muslim community, in light of the recent tragedy in New Zealand. John Frazer invited us to think of parishioners who might want to assist in the effort to find ways to generate additional income from our church facilities. Kirk Rich reported on new developments in the music program, including changes in the use of the music department’s space in the lower level of the parish house. Tim gave an update on the Worship Committee, which is holding listening sessions with parishioners. Tim also reported on the work of the Pastoral Care Task Force. Dot Miller discussed the progress of selecting a contractor for the repair of the louvers, rood beam, and refurbishing of the sanctuary bathrooms. Also, repairs to the chapel windows are needed due to rotting and discoloring. The vestry, clergy, and staff shared an Order for Evening. The vestry then met in executive session. The meeting was adjourned.

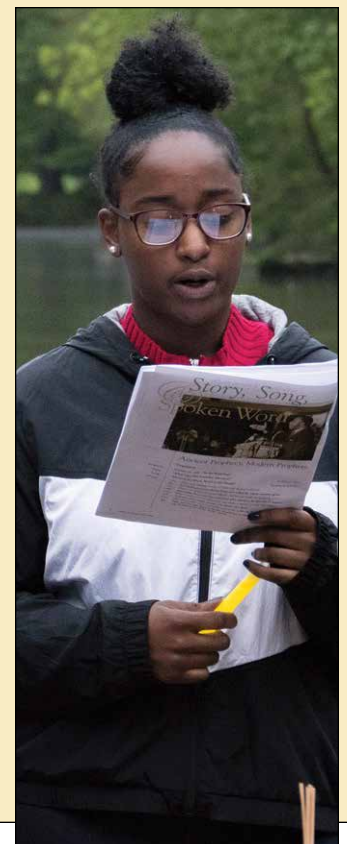
